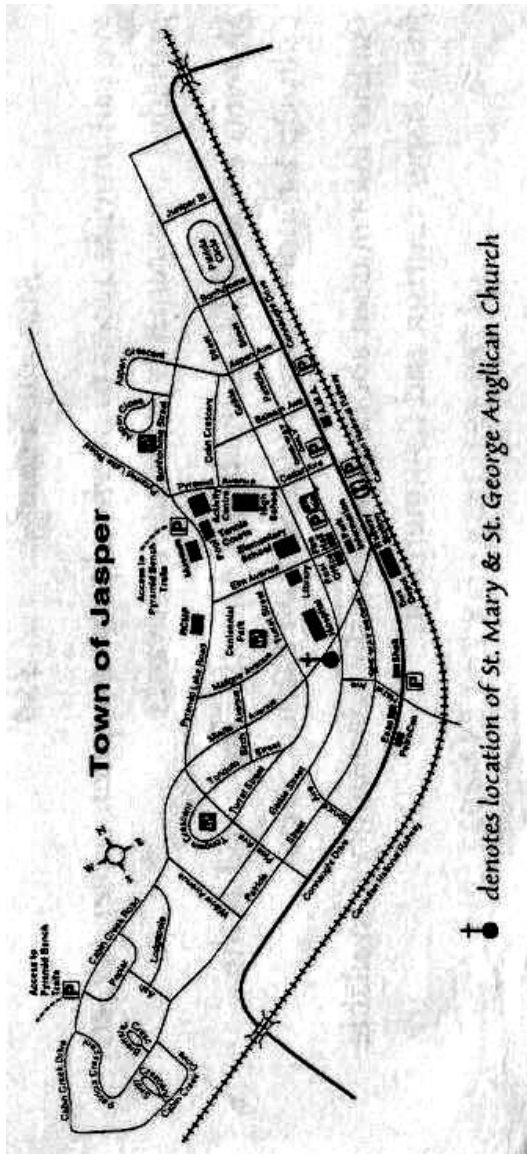


Church History

The original beginnings of Anglican ministry in the area was when Walter Leversedge, a travelling missionary, began his 39-year ministry in this diocese in 1909 - a tent and school building serving as the first house of worship until 1914 when, under the direction of the Rev'd G. Provis, a log church was constructed. On August 2nd, 1914 this log church was consecrated by the first Bishop of Edmonton, Henry Allen Gray.

The present church of St. Mary and St. George was designed by Mr. A.M. Calderon of Edmonton and built of local materials in 1928. It is a church of gifts from near and far, which began with an anonymous donor giving the present building as a memorial to her son. To complete the church the Edith Cavell Memorial Tower was added in 1932.

Furnishings were also part of the memorials given by various people. The Font came from the original old log church; the Ewer, the oak paneling in the sanctuary, the Altar Cross, the Processional Cross (in hand-beaten brass), the bell in the current bell tower all were gifts from many people.

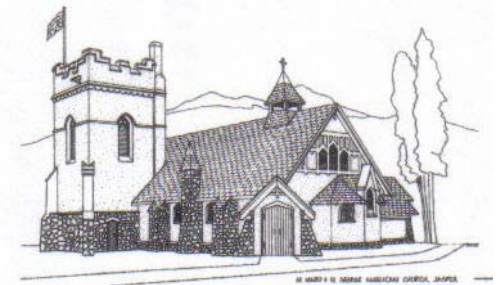
